Parent Tips to Help with End of Year Burnout!

- **1. Be Honest and Provide Guidance:** Help your child understand that learning should feel challenging and at some points, may even be a bit overwhelming! Remind them that this is normal, and help provide suggestions and expectations for things that may help.
 - a. staying 9th period
 - b. talking to/emailing the teacher
 - c. reviewing notes
- **2. Create and Enforce Daily Routines:** Schedules and routines are comforting for all of us. Knowing what to expect can help them work through difficult tasks and make sure they are both mentally and physically ready for what comes their way.
 - a. plan a scheduled time for homework
 - b. schedule opportunities for free time
 - c. remove electronics from bedrooms each night
 - d. place packed backpack and charged chromebook in an agreed upon location each night
- **3. Keep Scheduled Homework Times Reasonable:** Helping your child set up a homework schedule and expectations help homework to not be forgotten or get overwhelming.
 - a. break up long term assignments over several nights/weeks
 - b. get up and stretch or get a snack every 20-30 minutes
- **4. Eliminate Distractions** If a child is distracted, homework can seem like it takes "all night".
 - a. hold on to your child's phone until homework is complete
 - b. turn off TV
 - c. set up homework place that is well lit and has all supplies available
- **5. Schedule Down Time:** Knowing there is a time each day to just relax can help us all remain focused and motivated to complete our work/tasks to be able to take advantage of our down time.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICE (SRO)

<u>SEXTORTION</u> – the practice of extorting money or sexual favors from someone by threatening to reveal evidence of their sexual activity, usually inappropriate images.

Sextortion is more common than most people think. Homeland Security Investigations received more than 3000 reports in 2022 alone. One current trend targets young boys and girls. Predators pretend to be young girls or boys and feign romantic interest in the victim on social media sites or gaming platforms.

It starts when a child responds to an online request to expose themselves on a webcam or send inappropriate photos to their new online "friend". The next thing these children know is their new friend threatens to post the photos publicly – unless they provide more explicit photos or send money.

This terrifying and dehumanizing violation feeds on the victim's shame. The emotional result for victims – especially kids – is devastating.

You can protect your child against sextortion by monitoring their online activity and letting them know that they can talk to you about anything without being judged. If someone you know is victimized, contact your local police or the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.
